ur Bible story today is about a short man name Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus was collecting money for the Romans, but he was collecting more than he was supposed to. He was keeping the extra money for himself. [Show money.] When we take something that

belongs to someone else, it is called stealing. The Happiness Rules tell us that stealing is wrong. Stealing causes a lot of sadness in our world. Zacchaeus knew it was wrong to steal. He started to feel sorry for stealing. [Picture #1.]

One day, Zacchaeus heard that Jesus was

going to walk down the road near his home. Zacchaeus was excited. He wanted to see Jesus. He wanted to talk to Jesus, but he wasn't sure if Jesus would want to talk to him. Most people didn't like Zacchaeus because he was a thief.

Zacchaeus went to the road where Jesus was walking. There were many people there—so many that Zacchaeus couldn't see over their heads, because Zacchaeus was short.

"How can I see Jesus?" Zacchaeus wondered.





Animals That Climb

"So he ran ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see Him, for He was going to pass that way." Luke 19:4



ave you ever climbed a tree? In our Bible story today, Zacchaeus climbed a sycamore tree. There are many reasons why people, or animals, might want to climb a tree. Zacchaeus climbed so he could see Jesus. In God's animal world, many animals climb trees so they can see farther, find food, or be safe.

The baboon is one animal that is good at tree climbing. Baboons are good at climbing rocks, too. Baboons have very long tails. The baboons use their long tails to help them keep from falling when they are in a high place. By putting their tails this way or that, they are able to keep their balance.

The gecko lizard is another expert climber. God gave the geckos a special kind of foot that





helps them to hold onto and climb just about anything. Geckos can climb more than trees. They might climb right up a smooth wall, a piece of glass, or even walk upside down across a ceiling!

Squirrels are also very good at climbing. Squirrels have sharp little claws that help them to hold onto trees or whatever else they are trying to scamper up.

One of the best animal climbers, the cat, might live in your house. In a house, a cat might try to climb some curtains. That is not a good idea.

Jesus knew that some animals would need to climb trees, so He made them so that they could. Jesus also made the trees for the animals to climb. Isn't Jesus wonderful?
